- Build 50 hours of related field experience through an activity such as:
 - Complete an approved internship in the areas of environmental sciences, agricultural sciences, sustainability outreach, and communication
 - Complete an approved supervised classroom teaching program as required by your degree program
 - Participate in an environment, conservation, or sustainability-focused study abroad experience
 - Serve as a volunteer or intern for the campus Sustainability program
 - Serve as a volunteer in the Full Circle Food Pantry
 - Serve as a volunteer for the Razorback Food Recovery program
 - Serve as a volunteer in the Razorback Recycling program
 - Other related activity coordinated by the Volunteer Action Center and approved in advance by the PC Prep coordinator/advisor

The applicant must provide verifiable evidence of this activity. This may include a Service Transcript from the Volunteer Action Center or from the agency where the volunteer action occurred.
